INTRODUCTION & PURPOSE

The Saskatchewan College of Midwives (SCM) protects the public interest by ensuring that Saskatchewan registered midwives practice safely, competently and ethically.

PROCEDURE

Making a complaint about a midwife's professional practice is a serious matter. If there is a concern about unprofessional, unsafe or unethical midwifery practice in Saskatchewan, an individual or agency has the right to make a complaint to the College and to have it investigated. Although there is no time limit to register a complaint, the College should be notified of the concern as soon as possible.

Complainants are encouraged to contact the Registrar at the College to discuss these concerns and the complaint process.
